Some chambers do economic development for their community. We do not because the city has the Bastrop Economic Development Corporation. Others offer tourism and visitor center operations. The Bastrop Chamber of Commerce has provided this service to the city and been recognized by the State of Texas for this since 1997. As of the end of this year, your local chamber is shifting away from these functions so we can truly focus and

ing to further their collective interests, while advancing the community and region. Business owners in towns and cities voluntarily form these local networks to advocate on behalf of the community at large, to promote economic prosperity and for business interests. Chambers have existed in the U.S. for more than two centuries. Your Bastrop Chamber of Commerce was established in 1922.

Chamber missions vary, but they all tend to focus on five primary goals: Building communities to which residents, tourists and investors are attracted; promoting those communities;

striving to ensure future prosperity via a pro-business climate; representing the unified voice of the business community; and reducing transactional friction through well-functioning networks. Chambers have other features in common; most are led by private sector employers, they are self-funded, and led by a board of directors with working committees of enthusiastic volun-

This is very true of your Bastrop chamber.

While most chambers work closely with government, they are not part of government although many consider the process of appropriately influencing elected officials to be one of their most important functions. The chamber utilizes the relationships built with local, state and federal elected officials to effect change in laws and ordinances that impact our businesses.
