Commentary from Mayor Jay Tibshraeny @jaytibshraeny



In early May, the City of Chandler was recognized as a 2017 Healthy Arizona Worksite Gold Award recipient for excellence in worksite wellness. Our employees are committed to health and fitness. And, it relates well to our theme for this year's budget: "Chandler is Healthy and Fiscally Fit."

On May 25, the City Council tentatively adopted the 2017/2018 Fiscal Year Budget and the 2018/2027 Capital Improvement Plan. Final adoption is set for June 8, with adoption of the annual property tax levy on June 22.

The budget, at \$934.5 million represents a 3.8 decrease from last year; and a proposed property tax levy reduction of two-cents, down to \$1.14 per \$100 of assessed valuation. Yes, we still have some challenges that include an unstable global economic environment as well as an underfunded state public safety retirement system. But at the same time, I remain encouraged that our community continues to move in a good direction.

Chandler's solid economic foundation is the product of more than two decades of sound financial planning. Policies that have been strictly adhered to by those you have entrusted with your hard-earned tax dollars. I want to thank my fellow Councilmembers who fully understand the impacts of this strategy, and have worked tirelessly on this budget to ensure we remain fiscally strong.

The 2017/18 budget is a solid one, and we again are able to fund road projects, build parks and maintain basic services and infrastructure.

At the same time, we celebrated many successes over this past year (the fiscal year runs July 1 through June 30). We renovated and upgraded several parks, and we continue to construct and widen roads in south Chandler, aggressively maintain and improve others, and have undertaken some critical new utility projects.

We welcomed many new businesses to Chandler including Waymo's (formerly Google) autonomous vehicle testing site in west Chandler. Rogers announced it will move its headquarters to Chandler this year and Intel announced a \$7 billion expansion at its Ocotillo campus, generating several thousand jobs. The business community continues to find Chandler as an attractive place to locate and grow.

Thanks to our management team and budget staff for their dedicated work to prepare a prudent, sensible plan. This financial roadmap is the product of a long and transparent process -- and many hours of work on the part of our City staff, the City Council, and you, the residents of Chandler.

Thanks to my fellow City Councilmembers. They remain, as do I, committed to an unparalleled quality of life for our City and residents. We live in a tremendous community. One that is Healthy and Fiscally Fit!

City Issues RFP for Redevelopment of City-owned Property in Downtown Chandler

The City of Chandler has issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) to development firms interested in purchasing and developing what is known as Site 7, approximately 1.77 acres of City-owned property near the southeast corner of Arizona Avenue and Chandler Boulevard. The site is at the gateway of Downtown Chandler, a regional destination that hosts more than 70 special events each year and is home to a growing collection of restaurants. retailers, and office users. The intent of the RFP is to identify a development team that has the vision, experience, financial strength, and capacity to transform this highly visible and accessible property into a signature mixed-use project. The deadline to submit proposals is July 18th.

Road Restrictions in Chandler

Beginning Wednesday, June 14th, the eastbound lanes of Chandler Boulevard (south side of Chandler Boulevard), between California Street and Arizona Avenue, will be reduced from three lanes to two lanes as crews conduct street and utility work associated with the development on the southwest corner of Arizona Avenue and Chandler Boulevard. This work is expected to be completed by mid-July.

"A Brief History of the Gila River Indian Community," will be from 10:30 a.m. to noon at the Hamilton Library, located at 3700 S. Arizona Ave. Billy Allen, a member of the Gila River Indian Community, will use slides, tribal stories and personal recollections to tell the story of how the O'odham people have endured as the world around them changed. Our Stories is an ongoing series of Chandler and Arizona history presentations by quest speakers sharing stories and first-person accounts that are enhanced with multimedia presentations, demonstrations and music. The series is free, open to the public and presented by the Chandler Museum, Chandler Public Library, Chandler Historical Society and Friends of the Chandler Public Library.

Dignity Health will Present a conversation about opiates with prevention and treatment Professionals

Opioid overdose is the #1 cause of accidental death in the U.S. Arizona lost 1274 people to overdoses in 2015 which is up 4.4% from the year before. This presentation is designed to provide the effects of Prescription Medication and Opiate misuse, the facts surrounding opiates, reducing the Stigma of addiction, assisting individuals into treatment, and providing resources for any stage of an Opiate encounter. Fireworks Safety and Facts

Under Arizona law, the sale of permissible consumer fireworks is allowed from May 20 through July 6 and from December 10 through January 3. The use of permissible consumer fireworks is allowed June 24 through July 6 and from December 24 through January 3 on private property, with the permission of the property owner. Chandler prohibits the use of permissible consumer fireworks on any public property, including City-owned or managed land, buildings and facilities. This includes public parks, public school facilities, public retention basins, and public roads and streets within Chandler City limits. If you do decide to purchase and use fireworks in Chandler, it's important that you know the different rules for each of the three types: display, consumer and novelty fireworks. According to Chandler Fire, Health & Medical Department officials, display fireworks shoot into or through the air and may also detonate. These include the aerial devices that you typically see at large public Independence Day events. They are not legal to sell to consumers, and are not legal to use at any time in Chandler without a special event permit. Similar fireworks, including those that contain a higher percentage of black powder, such as M-80's, firecrackers, Roman candles, bottle rockets, etc., are also illegal. 11
