Harvesting bounty



There is always a sense of anticipation at Sabbath House on Thursdays during the summer gardening season. Thursdays are the day we pick up the produce from our CSA delivery spot. It is always great to see just what wonderful things God's good creation created for us for the week. Early summer has wonderful greens, such as a variety of kale, Swiss chard, lettuces, etc. Then green onions, radishes, zucchini, summer squash, cucumbers, tomatoes, etc., until the cooler days of summer when we receive broccoli, winter squash, onions, potatoes, carrots, peppers, etc. Then is the fun time of searching for favorite or new recipes to use the items, which can include wonderful summer salads, "hot dishes" and just new ways of serving lovely vegetables. These things are often carried to summer picnics/ potlucks. Of course there are times the abundance is more than we could possibly use, which gives us the pleasure of sharing, especially with our neighbor who is so generous with cutting our lawn when he does his. A few vegetables are little for his generosity.

Here is one of my favorite ways of using Swiss chard:

- Potato, cut into about 1 inch chunks.
- Onion, chopped.
- Bunch of Swiss chard, remove the stems. Chop stems into about 1 inch pieces and cut up leaves.
- Balsamic vinegar

• Feta cheese

Sauté potato and onion for about 5-10 minutes, add chopped chard stems. Continue to cook until all is tender, may cover for a period of time. Then add the chopped leaf part of the chard, sauté until wilted. Add a bit of balsamic vinegar. Serve with crumbled feta cheese on top. The amounts of each vegetable are easily adjusted based on number of desired servings and your preference.
