Patrick was born and raised in Rochester. His career in the restaurant industry began when he started working at Weathervane Seafood Restaurant while still in high school. Upon graduating from Spaulding High School, he went on to study accounting at McIntosh College and received his degree from New England College.

Patrick tried working behind a desk at an accounting firm but soon realized this was not the job for him. After a few weeks of pushing papers, Patrick left and returned to Weathervane Seafood Restaurant working in various positions and departments including accounting, computer systems, manager, and became district manager. It was while working at Weathervane Seafood Restaurant in Sanford under the management of his uncle and matchmaker, Howie Seckendorf, he would meet the love of his life, Michelle, who was a server there at the time.

With 350 seats in the restaurant and employing over 80 individuals, Patrick's staff praise him on creating a great work environment and admire his constant willingness to help anyone in need.

Patrick opens his function room doors for organizations to use at no charge such as the Rochester Police Department when they are in need of a space for training seminars, various Rochester school booster organizations, and the Chamber of Commerce for meetings and to provide breakfast to volunteers the morning of the Holiday Parade. Patrick has helped organizations such as the Chamber raise funds for their events through promotion to patrons.
