The coursework involves specific training in making home modifications so that anyone - regardless of age, ability or mobility level can remain in their home and live safely, comfortably and independently. Fewer than 3% of all remodelers in the country have achieved these designations.

Glen grew up in the southwest suburbs of Chicago and received his Bachelor's degree in communications from Bradley University in Peoria. He received his Illinois Teaching Certification from the University of Illinois-Chicago. A career as a high school history teacher earned Glen «Teacher of the Year» honors at Homewood-Flossmoor High School in the early 1980's. He lives in Tinley Park with his wife, Denise. They have raised two daughters and now enjoy being grandparents. Glen is an excellent club level tennis player and is still an avid history aficionado.

Last year he served as the Lt. Governor of Division 4 of the Illinois Eastern Iowa District of Kiwanis International. Ed is also a former school board member of Orland School District 135. He was president during three of his twelve years of service. Upon his election to trustee of the Village of Orland Park, Ed resigned from the school board. In 1985,

during the last six months of his four year term he served as Acting Village President after the death of Fred Owens. In 2002 Trustee Thomas Dubelbeis resigned and Ed was appointed to complete his term. Ed has since won re-election to Trustee for successive four-year terms in 2003, 2007 and 2011.

Shoveling Snow: Tips for Avoiding Injuries



Snow shoveling is a repetitive activity that can cause muscle strain to the lower back and shoulders. Back injuries due to snow shoveling are more likely to happen to people who may not know that they are out of condition. Following these 5 simple tips can help you avoid injuries and have a truly happy holiday:

1. Lift smaller loads of snow rather than heavy shovelful. Be sure to take care to bend your knees and lift your legs rather than your back.

2. Use a shovel with a shaft that lets you keep your back straight while lifting. A short shaft will cause you to bend more to lift the load. Using a shovel that's too long makes the weight at the end heavier. In addition, step in the direction in which you are throwing the snow to prevent the lower back from twisting. This will help prevent «next-day back fatigue.»

3. Avoid excessive twisting as the spine cannot tolerate twisting as well as it can tolerate other movements. Bend your knees and keep your back as straight as possible so that you are lifting with your legs.

4. Take frequent breaks when shoveling. Stand up straight and walk around periodically to extend the lower back.

5. Exercise while standing will help when you shovel. Stand straight and tall, place your hands toward the back of your hips, and bend backwards slightly for several seconds. Although these tips appear simple and logical they are often forgotten or overlooked. Goodlife Physical Therapy is dedicated to keeping you injury-free!
