

Credit Unions Exist to Improve the Lives of Consumers

Many people ask, "What is the difference between a bank and a credit union?" Most credit unions offer the same financial services that you would see at a bank for both consumer and business services. Credit Unions help their members buy vehicles and homes, make home improvements, pay for college, save for retirement and even finance their businesses. They also offer convenient services like free checking and debit cards, large surcharge-free ATM networks, mobile and internet banking and low-rate credit cards.

Credit unions are strategically different from banks because they are not-for-profit, financial cooperatives. That means they are owned and operated by the very people they serve - their

members. Banks are for-profit institutions that are owned by wealthy stockholders or businesses. Credit unions have unpaid boards of directors who are elected by fellow credit union members. Banks have paid stockholders. When credit unions grow, their members benefit. When banks grow, their stockholders benefit.

The philosophy of the credit union movement is "people helping people." It is a cooperative mission to help their members save money by paying lower interest rates on loans, lower fees for financial services and earning higher returns on savings. Credit Unions require a deposit to join which is usually between \$5 and \$50. This deposit remains in the member's account and represents his/her "share" or ownership in the credit union. Members can rest easy knowing that their funds are safe.

Credit Union funds are either federally insured by the National Credit Union

Administration or privately insured with companies like American Share Insurance. To join a Credit Union, you must meet their field of membership requirements.

Many credit unions are community-chartered which means if you live or work in their geographic area, you are eligible for membership. Family members of current members are usually eligible to join as well. Local employers often partner with credit unions to offer credit union financial services as an employee benefit. If you are thinking about joining a credit union, check the credit union's website for specific membership requirements.

Credit unions exist to serve their members and improve their financial lives with convenient, low-cost financial services.
