## Mayor's News and Notes



### State of the Village.

Thank you to the Orland Park Area

Chamber for inviting me to share the State of the Village at your February meeting. It's always nice to spend part of the day sharing the many great things happening in our community.

Annual Report. The first edition of the village newsletter is the annual report, which will arrive in the Orland Park Prairie this month. You can also access the newsletter on the village's website at [www.orland-park.il.us](http://www.orland-park.il.us). The Village Board and I are all very proud of the many milestones achieved in 2012 and we invite you to read about them in the report.

Business News. The year 2012 brought a number of business re-development projects to the village. Orland Square underwent a \$15 million dollar re-development with interior renovations and outdoor façade and entrance improvements. Madison

Construction expanded its Orland Park corporate headquarters, more than doubling its size from 10,000 square feet to a newly renovated, energy efficient 22,000 square feet building on 70th Court.

Riverdale Auto Body opened shop in the 108th Avenue Industrial Park. Dave & Busters has been busy since it debuted on the site of the former Orland Square Theatres. BMW of Orland Park built a 59,000 square foot state-of-the-art facility with environmental friendly features at 159th Street and Wolf Road. Berkot's Super Foods renovated the existing 40,000 square foot store front at 159th and Wolf and Whole Foods enjoyed a record breaking grand opening at 153rd and LaGrange. The Cheesecake Factory surpassed corporate expectations when it opened in Orland Square and Buona Beef built a beautiful free standing building at 131st and LaGrange.

In 2012, Orland Park also welcomed Blissful Banana Café on 94th Avenue, the Ruston Medical Clinic in the former Plunkett Furniture Building on Orland Square Drive, the Marquette Bank Retail Lending Center on 108th Avenue and the Hibachi Grill and Grand Buffet on 159th Street.

Residential News. Smith Crossing, the senior living center in the Orland Parkway of the I-80 Corridor, added a 200,000 square foot expansion. Thomas Place is an 80-unit apartment building

for residents age "55 and better." Construction is well underway at the northeast corner of Harlem and Wheeler.

Sheffield Square, a transit oriented development near the 153rd Street Train Station, is a townhome community with homes ranging in size from 1550 to 2100 square feet. This development has garnered attention from throughout the area with its phases quickly filling.

The Olde Mill Subdivision is located at 108th Avenue and Olde Mill Drive. This collection of beautiful, custom built homes is one of the newest subdivisions in the village. Sterling Ridge, also on 108th Avenue, includes 82 custom and customizable homes. New subdivisions along 143rd Street include Deerhaven and Wooded Path Estates.

"Annie" The village's Orland Park Theatre Troupe has been busily rehearsing for its spring musical, "Annie," presented at the Carl Sandburg High School Performing Arts Center April 26-28. Tickets are currently available at the Recreation Department.

# Resource Corner

## 8 Questions with 88 Graphics

We sat down with Chambergram designer and OPACC's "Opie the Owl" creator, Colin Walsh, owner of 88 Graphics Company to see what he has been up to...

### 1 How long have you been with OPACC?

I have been designing the OPACC Chambergram since 2007. Current OPACC President Marc Lochow was asked to lead a team that would give the chamber a marketing facelift. I had done a lot of freelance work with PrintSource Plus, and he asked me to become part of the committee as a graphic consultant. We presented a plan to the Board, which was accepted and I was hired to create the Chambergram.

The Chambergram has taken on some changes over the years; we try to keep it fresh for the readers.

### 2 Tell us about your experience with the Chamber?

Wow, it has been fantastic. We have had a small committee over the years, but Keloryn and Donna do all of the grunt work, and always with a smile on their faces. They are absolutely amazing at what they do. I have the fun job.

We worried our way through the first year, but it's at the point now, where I get the files emailed around the middle of the month,

they get the first revision a week later, and it's online and at the printer the next day. For all that goes into it, it goes pretty smoothly thanks to the OPACC staff.

### 3 What is 88 Graphics all about?

I started my own graphics business shortly after I graduated from SIU (Go Salukis!), as a part time venture ad it just grew by word of mouth.

While I love to illustrate more than anything, I design logos, marketing materials like brochures, newsletters, corporate identity pieces and web graphics. Lately, I have ventured into photo and video production and provide marketing consultation to several clients as well designing complete marketing programs for sales staffs.

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), commonly called ObamaCare, signed into passage in 2010, represents the most

significant government expansion and regulatory overhaul of our healthcare system since the passage of Medicare and Medicaid in 1965. and works extensively with the Department of Insurance regarding the impacts of the Affordable Care Act. He is serving his fourth term on the National Healthcare Task Force of the Independent Insurance Agents and Brokers of America in Washington D.C. This group supports their Government Affairs body working directly with Congressional members involved in Health Care Reform.
